

SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

When developing our policy, we considered the notions that our school uniform should:

- be practical and smart;
- be comfortable:
- be affordable for families;
- be designed with health and safety in mind;
- be a social leveller;
- promote a sense of pride, belonging and community in the school;
- enable easy identification of our children;
- prevent children from wearing unsuitable, impractical clothes that could distract from their learning.

We maintain a stock of second hand uniform in the school office; please use this cost-effective and environmentally-friendly resource.

As well as our second-hand stock, you can purchase uniform from most supermarkets and clothes shops, and items with our school logo from www.yourschooluniform.com. There is no requirement to have clothing with our school logo on.

School Uniform



Our school uniform colours are red, white and grey:

- √ red cardigan, sweatshirt or v-neck jumper
- ✓ grey skirt, pinafore, shorts or trousers
 ✓ white shirt (long or short sleeved) with silver and red striped tie or white polo shirt
- ✓ red and white checked dress (or culottes-style dress)
- ✓ white or grey socks or tights
- ✓ black shoes which you can fasten yourself

Your shoes must not have heels, open toes or platform sole. They must have a fastener so they stay on securely.

You will need a waterproof coat and / or a red fleece for outside.

PE Kit

On your PE lesson days (usually 2 days per week), you wear your PE kit to school:

- white t-shirt (it is a good idea to have one with a school logo if you go to inter-school sports events so that you can be easily identified)
- ✓ plain black shorts or joggers
- ✓ white or black trainers which you can fasten yourself
- ✓ white or black sports socks
- ✓ sweatshirt either the red school one or plain black

Your PE kit must be plain, not with large brand logos.

Your sweatshirt must not have a hood or a zip.



Hair







Hair which is long enough to touch your shoulders must be tied back with a red, white or black tie. Religious head coverings should also be red, white or black.

Watches

If you can tell the time, you may wear a watch which we take off for PE. Smart watches which have games, call or message people, or take photos are not allowed.

Jewellery

If you have pierced ears, you may wear a small, simple stud. You must not wear earrings on your PE days. No other jewellery is allowed in school.

Bags

Children in EYFS or KSI (Oak, Ash or Willow classes) should have a red school book bag. In KS2, you can bring in a rucksack.

Forest School

When it is your class' turn for Forest School (each class has one day per week for a particular half term), you will need to bring in the following to change into:

- √ warm, comfortable clothes (like a tracksuit) which can get muddy and also cover your legs
- ✓ waterproof coat and trousers
- ✓ wellies
